MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING

February 27, 2012

I. ROLL CALL AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF A QUORUM

The February meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Public School Retirement System of the City of St. Louis (PSRSSTL) was called to order at 4:40 p.m., Monday, February 27, 2012. The meeting was conducted in the 2nd floor boardroom of the PSRSSTL office building located at 3641 Olive Street, St. Louis, Missouri. Joseph Clark, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, was the presiding officer.

Roll Call was taken and Trustees Christina Bennett, Joseph Clark, Mona Lawton, Yvette Levy, Thaha Menkara and Charles Shelton were present. The Board of Trustees had a quorum at the meeting. Trustee Sarah Sise joined the meeting in progress. Trustee Rick Sullivan was absent.

Executive Director, Andrew Clark, PSRSSTL Attorney, Jeff Hartnett, PSRSSTL Actuary, Steve Siepman, and a large audience of interested parties were also in attendance.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM LAST MEETING

Thaha Menkara made a motion, seconded by Christina Bennett, to approve the minutes of the Board of Trustees Regular Meeting of December 12, 2011.

By voice vote, motion carried.

III. SEATING OF NEW BOARD MEMBERS

The Chairperson announced the re-appointment of Rick Sullivan to the Board of Trustees by the SLPS Special Administrative Board.

The Chairperson welcomed Yvette Levy to the Board of Trustees. Ms. Levy was elected as an Active Teacher Trustee.

IV. READING OF COMMUNICATIONS TO THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

V. PRESENTATIONS BY INTERESTED PARTIES

Retirees Al Katzenberger, Steven Fuchs, Pat Laughlin and Jim Hamilton expressed concerns over Board communications and the lack of a COLA or other increased benefits. Ms. Laughlin presented a memo requesting an annual membership meeting for all members of the retirement system that will be acknowledged by the retirement system.

There were two people unaffiliated with the retirement system from the audience, Annie Quain and Eugene Fowler, who were allowed to make presentations to the Trustees. Ms. Quain spouted rhetoric, became disorderly and fired up the audience until she was asked to take her seat or be escorted by security out of the building. Mr. Fowler spoke on injustice in general until his time ran out.

VI. CONSENT AGENDA

Thaha Menkara made a motion, seconded by Mona Lawton, to approve the Retirements and Benefits of December 2011 and January 2012.

By voice vote, motion carried.

Christina Bennett made a motion, seconded by Mona Lawton, to approve the Refunds and Bills of December 2011 and January 2012.

By voice vote, motion carried.

VII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Charles Shelton made a second reading of a proposed rule change to Chapter A., Rule X. Election of Trustees and Procedures for Elections, Section 10, as follows:

"If no candidate or only one candidate properly registers for the position of trustee for any election of a trustee, the registration process shall be reopened and the Election Commissioner shall mail another notice of the election of a trustee establishing a new registration deadline for the registration of candidates, which shall be two weeks after the date of mailing of such new notice, or if such date is a legal holiday, on the following business day. If only one candidate properly registers for the position of trustee after two mailings of a notice for any election of a trustee, then the election shall proceed with only one candidate. If no candidate registers after two mailings of a notice for any election of a trustee, election notices shall be mailed until at least one candidate has properly registered."

Mr. Shelton made a motion, seconded by Thaha Menkara, to adopt the amendment to the Trustee election procedures in Chapter A., Rule X., Section 10, as proposed in the second reading.

VIII. REPORT OF THE CHAIRPERSON

The Chairman established the 2012 committees of the Board of Trustees and made chair assignments for each committee as follows:

Benefits Committee – Charles Shelton Trustee Business Committee – Christina Bennett Investment Committee – Joe Clark Legislative, Rules & Regulations Committee – Mona Lawton Professional Contracts Committee – Sarah Sise

The Chairman reported on a meeting regarding COLA's that took place with Trustees Charles Shelton and Joe Clark, the Attorney, the Actuary and the Executive Director. The Chairman asked the

Attorney and Actuary to explain the specifics behind the authority for the Board of Trustees to grant a COLA to retirees. The Attorney was specific in spelling out the conditions that simultaneously must be met to grant such a COLA as follows: the fund must be at least 80% funded prior to the COLA, the fund cannot drop below 75% funded after the COLA, there cannot be an increase in contributions required to be paid by employers and employees as a result of the COLA, and the fund must be actuarially sound. The Actuary stated that all these conditions cannot be met by the retirement system because an increase in benefits would lead to an increase in the actuarial liability which would require an increase in the amount of contributions paid by the employers to fund the COLA. There was some discussion on when all conditions could be met to pay a COLA. At a minimum the fund would have to be at least 100% funded and the required contributions would have to be calculated at that time to determine whether or not an increase in the employer contributions would occur as a result of the COLA.





BOARD OF TRUSTEES ADOPTED RULE AMENDMENT FEBRUARY 27, 2012

At a Regular Meeting on February 27, 2012, the Board of Trustees adopted a rule amendment and revised Chapter A., Rule X., Election of Trustees and Procedures for Elections, Section 10 as follows:

If no candidate or only one candidate properly registers for the position of trustee for any election of a trustee, the registration process shall be reopened and the Election Commissioner shall mail another notice of the election of a trustee establishing a new registration deadline for the registration of candidates, which shall be two weeks after the date of mailing of such new notice, or if such date is a legal holiday, on the following business day. If only one candidate properly registers for the position of trustee after two mailings of a notice for any election of a trustee, then the election shall proceed with only one candidate. If no candidate registers after two mailings of a notice for any election of a trustee, election notices shall be mailed until at least one candidate has properly registered.
