MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES REGULAR MEETING

February 26, 2024

I. ROLL CALL AND ANNOUNCEMENT OF A QUORUM

The February meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Public School Retirement System of the City of St. Louis (PSRSSTL) was called to order at around 4:36 p.m. on Monday, February 26, 2024. The meeting was conducted by video conference through Zoom and a Livestream on YouTube. Louis Cross, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, was the presiding officer.

Roll Call was taken. Angie Banks, Louis Cross, Christina Bennett, Sheila Goodwin, Emily Hubbard, Shanise Johnson, Martel Mann, Bobbie Richardson, and Albert Sanders were present. The Board of Trustees had a quorum at the meeting. Trustees Yvette Levy and Dorris Walker were absent.

Executive Director Susan Kane, PSRSSTL Accounting Specialist Terry Mayes, and Attorney Representative Matt Gierse were also in attendance.

II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES FROM LAST MEETING

Sheila Goodwin made a motion, seconded by Bobbie Richardson, to approve the minutes of the Regular Board of Trustees Meeting from December 18, 2023. By voice vote, the motion carried.

III. SEATING OF NEW MEMBER—EMILY HUBBARD, SLPS BOARD OF EDUCATION APPOINTMENT

Vice Chair Bobbie Richardson and other Trustees welcomed Emily to the Board of Trustees.

VI. CONSENT AGENDA

VII. REPORT OF THE CHAIRPERSON

The Chairman announced that all the Committee Co-Chairs would remain the same except for the addition of adding Emily Hubbard to the Benefits Committee, replacing Donna Jones. He also mentioned that he would be visiting Jefferson City on Tuesday, February 27 to discuss pending legislation on the System's funding. He will also be attending a hearing regarding the proposed

legislation to provide an additional one-time payment of up to \$2,000 to current retirees. He also mentioned that he had previously spoken at a hearing regarding legislation to add two Charter School members to the Board of Trustees.

VIII. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Executive Director reported that all PSRSSTL Staff and Trustees had completed the required Code of Ethics form. She also mentioned that Cyber Liability coverage had been renewed effective February 1, 2024. She also reviewed some statistics regarding member contribution refunds processed, total 2023 retirement payroll, and 1099-R Tax forms that were distributed.

The Executive Director then reviewed a request from Gallagher to increase their fees. Gallagher provides insurance consulting services to the System. The current fee has been in place for twelve years but would be a significant increase over current. After discussion was concluded, Albert Sanders made a motion, seconded by Shanise Johnson to authorize a fee increase of \$63,000 from \$39,840, guaranteed for three years, for Gallagher, the System's Insurance Consultant, with no increase to the approved 2024 Operating Budget.

Investment Committee Meeting Minutes

Christina Bennett, Investment Committee Co-Chair, called the meeting to order at around 4:35 p.m. The meeting was conducted by video conference through Zoom and a Livestream on YouTube.

Roll call was taken. Trustees Angela Banks, Louis Cross, Emily Hubbard, Bobbie Richardson, and Dorris Walker were in attendance. A quorum was present at the meeting. Trustees Christina Bennett, Sheila Goodwin, and Shanise Johnson joined the meeting in progress. Trustees Yvette Levy, Martel Mann, and Albert Sanders were absent. Executive Director Susan Kane, and Investment Consultant Representatives Gwelda Swilley and Jeff Kuchta were also present.

Investment Consultant Representative Kuchta began an overview of the Quarterly Report for the 4th Quarter of 2023. The discussion began with a review of the overall capital markets, which showed solid returns, particularly for US stocks. He then reviewed the asset allocation chart, which details if the portfolio was in compliance with the System's policy. Overall, in the various categories, asset allocation targets were met. He also explained that any cash needed for the System's pension payments and expenses would be taken from any of the managers that were above the target allocation. The next discussion topic from the report was a review of the fees including the annual fee anticipated being paid to each manager. Once each year, this report includes a comparison of the managers' fees against their peers. He also pointed out that most of the managers had met their annual goals for minority brokerage trading.

Mr. Kuchta then provided a detailed review of each of the managers' performance for the quarter and their comparison to the benchmark. He highlighted a few managers that had trailed their benchmarks and suggested that AndCo would work on a schedule for some of the managers to meet with the Committee at upcoming meetings throughout the year. There was also some discussion about possibly adding another large cap value manager since the current manager currently accounts for 8.2% of the total portfolio.

There was also a review of the System's portfolio of private market investments. Investment Committee Co-Chair Bennett and Investment Consultant Representative Kuchta provided an explanation of how these investments work and the meaning of the various numbers on the report for each of the managers. Finally, there was a discussion of the Watch List. While there were some managers who had met the criteria to be placed on the watch list, AndCo did not have any serious concerns about the managers as the investment results were explainable and not due to any adverse actions taken by the manager.

After the conclusion of the performance discussion, Investment Consultant Swilley led a discussion on the purchase of AndCo by Mariner. Mariner is a national wealth advisory firm and had no institutional services. AndCo only offered institutional services and so after being approached and careful review, agreed to the purchase. As of April 2, AndCo will become Mariner Institutional. She assured the Committee that there would be no change in Account Managers with the new firm. Ms. Swilley then asked the Committee to authorize the Executive Director to sign the consent letter.

Investment Committee Co-Chair Bennett made a motion, seconded by Bobbie Richardson, to recommend approval of consent for the Mariner acquisition of AndCo

Mr. Kuchta then provided a detailed review of each of the managers' performance for the quarter and their comparison to their benchmarks. He highlighted a few managers that had trailed their benchmarks, but this month's report had some encouraging numbers. At the end of his report, he mentioned that the System had a pending redemption request from a real estate manager. It is likely to take several years to redeem the amount requested due to current market conditions. This manager has a new program which could help save fees for the System until the market conditions improve. AndCo is reviewing and will present their recommendation at a future meeting.

After all business had been concluded, Albert Sanders made a motion, seconded by Dorris Walker to adjourn. By voice vote, motion carried, and the meeting adjourned at around 6:07 p.m.

Mitel has provided good reliable service and several tools, including reporting and call recording, not available from prior vendors. Unfortunately, in June of 2022, Mitel announced that they would no longer be selling the Mitel Cloud Connect service. They would continue to support PSRSSTL's service for the three-year term but urged their existing customers to move to Ring Central, who will eventually take over Mitel's Cloud Connect customers.

PSRSSTL staff and Blade, the System's Technology vendor, have been researching options for a new phone provider over the last several months. We reviewed options from three vendors: Tech Electronics, Ring Central, and Zultys (formerly known as IT Voice).

After discussion with Tech Electronics on services needed by PSRSSTL, they declined to provide a bid as their cost would be significantly more expensive to current and in comparison, to other vendors in the market.

Ring Central would offer similar services to Mitel Cloud Connect but some features, such as call recording, would be limited. Service is also a concern. Blade has reported that some of their customers have not been pleased with the service provided by Ring Central. PSRSSTL experienced this during a review of the Ring Central product when answers to questions were delayed in being received or not received at all. Their quoted fee of \$270/month did not include call recording. Stability of pricing is also a concern. Even though the System had a three-year price guarantee with Mitel, some items did increase in price during the last three years. As Mitel's official partner, it is anticipated that Ring Central will continue with such practices of increasing prices on some services, despite any pricing guarantees obtained.

Zultys offers all the services that PSRSSTL needs, including reporting and call recording. Service is provided locally. Blade recommends Zultys as they have worked with other clients who have implemented and are pleased with their services. The three-year pricing at \$279/month is comparable and slightly less expensive than the current Mitel Cloud Connect fees. There is also a one-time installation charge of \$469.

<u>Recommendation</u>: To select Zultys as PSRSSTL's new phone provider effective June 1, 2024.

Subject: Legal Services for Legislative Work

At the February 26, 2024, Board Meeting, the PSRSSTL Board of Trustees approved selecting Husch Blackwell as the new provider of attorney services effective April 1, 2024.

Prior to this time and for the last several years, Hartnett Reyes, the System's prior provider of legal services, had been working with legislators on a solution to the decreasing contribution rate because of legislation passed in 2017. As a result of these discussions, Representative Doug Clemens filed House Bill 2846 and Senator Karla May filed Senate Bill 1504, which would positively impact the System's contribution rate and rely once again on the Actuary to determine the employer contribution rate, subject to certain limits.

Hartnett Reyes has been working on a variety of activities related to this legislation, including attending hearings, drafting correspondence, and one on one discussions with legislators. In conversations with Husch Blackwell, they suggested that it would be difficult for their firm to seamlessly continue the work being done on this legislation as of April 1, 2024. A sudden change in legal counsel may also cause questions or concerns to legislators considering these bills.

Board Chairman Louis Cross, Vice Chairperson Bobbie Richardson, and Treasurer Sheila Goodwin met with myself on Thursday, March 28, 2024, to discuss the possibility of retaining legal services with Hartnett Reyes for PSRSSTL legislative work only. This would include work on the two bills that have been filed as well as monitoring any other legislation impacting PSRSSTL through the current session which is scheduled to end on May 17, 2024. The Officers of the PSRSSTL Board of Trustees authorized up to \$10,000 for Hartnett Reyes to continue their legislative work for the System.

PSRSSTL Rules and Regulations also require any emergency action taken by the Officers to be ratified and approved by the Board at the next Board Meeting. By taking emergency action, the Officers ensured that action being taken on legislation that would fix the System's current funding deficit could continue without interruption. We respectfully request that the Board ratify and approve this action.

<u>Recommendation</u>: To approve Hartnett Reyes to continue legislative work only for PSRSSTL through the end of the 2024 legislative session, scheduled to end on May 17, 2024.
